### REPORT ON DRT AND MONTHLY TESTS – CLASSES IX TO XII

"Practice is the hardest part of learning, and training is the essence of transformation."

To strengthen daily learning and promote consistent revision habits among students, Daily Routine Tests (DRTs) have been implemented for classes IX to XII. These tests are conducted every morning from 8:15 a.m. to 9:15 a.m. with the objective of making students thoroughly familiar with the concepts taught in the classroom.

A fixed schedule is followed wherein two subjects are covered each day, ensuring balanced preparation across all subjects. Questions are provided well in advance and are communicated through the students' handbooks and the Neverskip parent app, ensuring that both students and parents are well-informed.

Students write these tests daily, and subject teachers correct them on the same day, recording the marks promptly. This consistent system of testing and immediate feedback keep nts actively engaged and academically alert.

In addition to DRTs, Monthly Tests are conducted to assess the students' cumulative understanding. The question papers for monthly tests are framed with a balanced structure: 80% of the questions focus on textbook-based revision, while 20% are creative and application-based questions, encouraging higher-order thinking.

The Monthly Test schedules conducted this month are as follows

Class XI and XII: 23/06/2025 to 26/06/2025 Class X: 27/06/2025 to 01/07/2025 Class IX: 02/07/2025 to 04/07/2025

The core purpose behind conducting DRTs and Monthly Tests is to instill discipline in home preparation, enabling students to study and revise regularly rather than writing at home. This practice helps in building a strong academic foundation and improves their readiness for board exams.

### NEVERSKIP TEACHER APP TRAINING

A focused training session on the Neverskip Teacher App was conducted on 26/6/25, Thursday aimed at equipping all teaching staff with efficient usage of the app for academic documentation and analysis. The training was organized in two sessions:

Session I: 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM – for Classes I to VIII teachers Session II: 5:15 PM to 6:00 PM – for Classes IX to XII teachers

All teachers attended the training with their mobile phones, having the Neverskip Teacher App pre-installed. The session was headed by Madam Principal, and the training was conducted by Mr. Roosevelt, who gave a comprehensive demonstration of the application. His presentation highlighted the importance of the tool in tracking and extracting student academic performance from Classes I to XII

Introduction and navigation of Academic 3.0, Step-by-step guidance on entering marks for various assessments, and explanation of the procedures for updating and modifying marks were discussed.

The training was well utilised by the faculty members. It enhanced their understanding of the platform and emphasized the role of digital tools in academic analysis. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A segment, ensuring all staff was confident in implementing the procedures discussed.
